#### **EYFS**

As part of our topic 'Can I Have A Dog Yet?' the children have read the Funnybones story 'The Pet Shop'. During continuous provision, the children have enjoyed looking at X-Ray photos of different body parts as well as exploring our human anatomy model. They also



had a go at making their own skeleton pictures.



In maths, the children took part in a variety of investigations to learn about capacity. Each class set up 4 stations for the children to work around. They worked

together to answer questions such as 'How many cups of water can we pour from the teapot?' and 'How many spades of sand will fill the bucket?'

Thanks to the sunny weather, the children have been very busy outside. Each class has planted flowers and vegetables in our garden and are enjoying watering and maintaining them. We have begun practising our dance for the dance festival and the children cannot wait to perform for their families.

#### Year 1

The children have really enjoyed our 'Paws, Claws and Whiskers' topic. We have learnt about different animals and their habitats. The children made lots of animal themed artwork and they have learnt about what life is like in Africa. We had a great time at Twycross Zoo and came face to face with the animals we have been learning about!

In English the children have written their very own stories and made them into books.

In maths the children have been learning about halves and quarters of shapes and quantities. They have also been learning to show multiplication using arrays and how to share objects into equal groups.





# Year 2

This terms topic has taught us a lot about different minibeasts, where they live and what they eat. After researching about different minibeasts we created a fact file to present all the interesting facts we learnt. In science we have learnt about life cycle of a bee and how bees make honey. Did you know that bees have two stomachs? One for eating and the other for collecting nectar. We are looking forward to new topic next term: Scented Gardens.

### Year 3


In Year 3 we've fallen in love with storytelling! Everyone has been working very hard to learn a story, and then write it changing some parts to make it our own. First we listened carefully to our teachers who told us the exciting story of The Freedom Bird. When writing, we challenged ourselves to include: inverted commas, expanded noun phrases, adverbs and subordinating conjunctions.

We also wrote poems about the story then read them aloud as a class.



Our Maths lessons have also been very exciting as we've been measuring angles, mass and volume. We love hands on learning!

Next week, we will finish our half term with a visit to Leicester Synagogue to learn more about the values of Judaism.



#### Year 4

This half term we were able to visit a local Gudwara and learn more about the Sikh faith. The experience was really interesting for us and the children were really engaged and asked lots of questions during the visit.

As a year group, we have been exploring one of our characteristics of learning. We discussed 'Gratitude', what this means to us and how we show it is our everyday lives. We used this discussion to create our own art work by printmaking. We really enjoyed learning how to practise this new skill, including scoring Styrofoam, using rollers and printing our designs.

Using the story of The Freedom Bird, we have been able to develop our oracy skills in English and use this tale to inspire us to write our own adaptation of it using our year four writing expectations. We have continued to use Harry Potter as our quality text, this has been so engaging that we have been able to extend our reading skills and furthermore, create our own narratives based on ideas from this text.

We are looking forward to taking a road-trip across the United States of America next half term in our new topic 'Road-trip USA'. We are currently getting our passports ready in preparation for this journey!





### Year 5

We have really enjoyed learning to retell stories as part of our 'Time Travellers' topic. We immersed ourselves in Godmother Death, a Mexican folk story about power, justice and mercy. To begin with, we represented the story using art and poetry. The thesaurus became our best friend in helping us collect new and interesting vocabulary. Using this vocabulary, we wrote some sinister character descriptions of our main character before becoming news reporters. We were tasked with reporting the disappearance of one of the characters in the story. We worked really hard to impress our reader with our excellent vocabulary. We love learning stories off by heart, and we have just begun to do the same with *The Freedom* Bird.

In maths, we have been learning all about angles. We have learned to recognise acute, obtuse, right, straight line and reflex angles. We have become more accurate in using a protractor to not only measure the different types of angles, but also draw a specific angle. We've begun to notice patterns in shapes as well. For example, the sum of the interior angles in a triangle equal to 180°, a quadrilateral to 360° and a pentagon to 540°. We're continuing our learning with angles and shape in the coming weeks.

Over the last few weeks, Year 6 have been working incredibly hard for their SATs. We are very grateful for the support that you as parents have given us and for the children for attending boosters and working as hard as they have. We have been really impressed with their attitude, focus and resilience in a very demanding week. We have been working on our Oliver narratives and learning how to add suspense and dialogue to advance action in our writing. After Half Term, we are now looking forward to our brilliant production of Robin and the Sherwood Hoodies and going swimming every Monday.
