Everything we are doing is to help keep you and others safe.

ARRIVING IN SCHOOL

Coming to school

Stay safe by making sure that you stay away from anyone who does not live in your house and don't touch anybody or anything.

Entering the school site

You can only have one adult to bring you onto the school site, or you may choose to walk to school by yourself.

When you come into the school grounds, you will need to stay with your adult, or by yourself and stay away from other people including your friends. You can wave to say hello but must not go up to them.

When you line up, make sure you stay 2 metres apart from the people in front.

You will go into a different building to normal but the teacher you will be with will be there to say hello and see you into school.

Children will be coming into school at different times so your grown-ups have plenty of time to bring you safely to the classroom door and keep the 2 metre distance rule.

Times and classrooms

Week beginning Monday 22nd June

6A bubble – with Mrs Hill - 9am at the rear of the Six acres building near the staff car park. (The car park will be empty). Collect from the same location at 12pm.

6B bubble – with Miss West – 9am at the front of the Six acres building near the KS2 playground. Collect from the same location at 12pm.

Week beginning Monday 29th June

6C bubble – with Miss Pears – 9am at the front of the Six acres building near the KS2 playground. Collect from the same location at 12pm.

6D bubble – with Mrs Hill – 9am at the rear of the Six acres building near the staff car park. (The car park will be empty). Collect from the same location at 12pm.

If children have permission to walk home from school alone, they will be dismissed at 12pm.

CLASSROOMS



You will be in a different classroom from the one you used to be in. You may be with a different teacher or adult.

As soon as you enter the classroom you must go and give your hands a wash. Remember to wash them for at least 20 seconds.

There will be a paper towel in the classroom for you to take to dry your hands. You can throw it away in the bin after you have washed your hands.

Your teacher will tell you where you can sit and where to put your coat. Each child **must** bring their **own drink bottle** with them. They can also bring in a **pencil case** with pen, pencil and colouring pencils/pens in.

You do not need sun cream – please apply this at home before school.

You do not need to bring your school bag.

You do not need to bring your PE kit.

You **must not** bring in phones.

Your classroom will look very different. The teachers have moved the tables apart and lots of our equipment has been put away in a safe place as we don't want you to touch anything that you shouldn't touch. Anything that you do touch will be regularly cleaned. We will keep the doors and windows open to let in some fresh air and so that you don't need to touch the door handle.



You will be in a classroom with a small number of your class mates. Your classroom and teachers may be different to your normal teachers. You will have the same adults with you for your time in school. This is your 'bubble'. There are lots of different 'bubbles' and you need to make sure that you do not go near children from other bubbles- even at playtime. Remember that we are keeping everyone safe.

You will stay in your 'bubble' all week.

If the adults in school need to go to another place they will follow the 2 metre rule too. We are all in this together!

SOCIAL DISTANCE

Keep yourself and others safe. Maintain a 2m distance.



TOILETS AND HYGIENE

Only one person can go to the toilet at a time.

Adults will regularly clean the door handles and doors during the day.

Remember that washing hands is very important and you will be doing this throughout the morning.



As well as washing your hands, you can keep yourself and everything around you clean and free of germs by following these simple rules

Try not to touch your face.

Stay at least 2 metres apart.

Do not touch other children and adults.

If you cough or sneeze, use a tissue and put it in the bin.

PLAYTIME AND LUNCHTIME

We are very lucky at Parkland because we have a wonderful outdoor space. The teachers will make sure that we can use it safely and that we do not mix with children in other 'bubbles'.

You will be able to play with the children who are in your 'bubble' but nobody else.

The playgrounds have been split into 'zones'. You will have a zone that you can play in. You must not go into the other zones.

You will have some equipment to use outside. This is for your group only and it will be washed at the end of every day.

HOME TIME

Your grown-ups can collect you at 12pm or you can walk home alone. One of your teachers will check the areas outside of the classroom door to see who has arrived and will call you from your desk when they have seen your grown-up.

Only one of your grown-ups can come and collect you. They will wait outside the classroom door and make sure they are 2 metres apart from other grown-ups.

You will wash your hands before leaving for home.

When you get home. Your uniform will need to be washed.

What happens if I am ill?

If you are ill, you will not be coming to school.

If someone in your house is ill or if they could get very ill from the virus, you will not be coming to school.

If someone gets ill in school, they will be sent home and if anyone in your 'bubble' gets the virus, your bubble will need to stay at home for 2 weeks, just to make sure that they're all OK.

We will have our first aid kits in our classrooms, so if you have an accident we can treat most things in the classroom or on the playground.

If you are feeling unwell a first aider may take you to the medical room to wait for your grown up to collect you. The first aider will wear a mask, gloves and apron to keep you and them safe and will have to stay at least 2 metres away from you.

The adults in school have been thinking very carefully about how to make things safe for when you return to school.

We can't wait to see you all!

Remember that we are all in this together!
