Pre-School

This term, the children have been curious about the changes in the weather. We have discussed winter and the different types of weather we experience. The children have taken part in experiments with water, explored how the ice melts and enjoyed a day of playing in the snow





Foundation

This term the Foundation children have been learning about **Farming.** In literacy, they have been reading lots of different animal stories. They learnt about the Life Cycle of a chicken. The children have been using their phonics to write some sentences about what they have learnt. In maths, they been **learning about addition** and subtraction.



The children at home took part in a competition to make a vegetable picture. The children in school have enjoyed taking part in Well Being Week and making their own posters.





Year 1


In maths, Year 1, have been adding and subtracting numbers up to 20 using a variety of methods and we have been improving our maths fluency by playing the online game, *Numbots*.

We have recently been exploring and representing numbers up to 50.





Year 1 have also have enjoyed their *Moon Zoom* topic this term. We have been learning about the life and achievement of Neil Armstrong and have written some fantastic sentences about him. We have been reading lots of stories to do with space and we even had an alien spaceship crash on the KS1 playground!



The children have also learnt how to use some new punctuation; the exclamation mark and the question mark.

The children in Year 1 have been working so hard whether they are in school or at home and the teachers are very proud of them



Year 2



Year 2 have been **learning to multiply and divide in Maths**. They have found the introduction of Times Tables Rock Stars has really helped them to build up their fluency.



In English they have been writing reports about animals which has linked brilliantly to their learning in Science about different animal groups. Another success has been the Artwork that the children have been creating, including some very creepy wasps!



They have really embraced the PE and Wellbeing activities too. All of the children in school and at home have shown some superb resilience and we are so proud of them all!






Year 3

Well, it may be lockdown, but there is no locking down on the learning, we are doing in Year 3, this half term. Whether in school or at home, the effort and engagement of our children and parents to the live and recorded lessons, has been outstanding. In Maths, we used lots of images to represent and strategies to solve multiplication and division and to improve our times table fluency.









In English, we have been using our **Greek Myths** class text as stimulus for writing a myth, instructions, and a persuasive letter, as well as the comprehension texts as we learn our inference and word knowledge skills. We also discovered how the first theories on light came from Greek Philosophers and we used similar ray diagrams to show how light travels and how shadows are formed. We also created some vase and mask designs.

We would like to thank all our parents/carers and children for the positive messages, we have received and their patience with the new technology and new ways of learning.




Year 4

This half term, Year 4 have been focused on saving the planet!

Inspired by our amazing class text 'Song of the Dolphin Boy', we have been finding out about the impact of deforestation and plastic pollution on habitats and environments.

The children in school and learning online have all worked so hard to discover why this is having such a negative **impact on our planet and the living things who call it home.** We have then spent time considering how we can reduce the amount of plastic we use in our daily lives and therefore the amount of plastic waste which ends up littering our land and waters.





We have been extremely impressed with the positive attitude and resilience we have seen from all our Year 5 pupils this half term. They have all had to adapt to a new way of learning, having lessons from different teachers and not seeing so much of their friends but they have all been amazing!


Alice and the rainbow waterfall

Standing very tall and strong, the majestic glant tree towers over the rainbow waterfall like an overprotective big sibling. The rainbow waterfall keeps running, like the naughty younger sibling it has become. In the background, the tall dark mountain sits alone like the forgotten middle

The splash of the water falling into the pool sounds even louder due to movements under its clear rainbow surface. The wavy pink coral, under the surface, of the water moves from left to right to avoid the invader tryin to grasp it cruelly from its sandy bed. The pink coral feels relief to see the intruder swim far away.

In English, Year 5 have been focusing on the book Tom's Midnight Garden by Philippa Pearce and this has inspired our written work. The children have created and written about their own setting using lots of wonderful vocabulary and figurative language. have also looked in detail at the characters from the book and written a summary of the whole story.

In maths, they have been learning about long multiplication and long division. They have had to be very resilient when looking at long division as the method we used was new learning for them. However, they have persevered and many of them are now feeling very confident with this new method. In Science, they have been learning about the properties of materials. They have tested different materials, used different methods for separating materials and used dissolving to see if a material is soluble or insoluble. It was great to see so many children doing these activities at home.



The children also enjoyed participating in the Well-being week, and having time to focus on their own wellbeing and mental health.

Last week, Year 6 also got another chance to show off their creative skills, with their fabulous wellbeing wave artwork!

Year 6 have been learning about the Mayas this term and we have done some fantastic learning in and out of school. We learned all about their lives, read about them in Guided Reading, wrote the Maya creation story and then we created some masks based on Mayan designs.

PE & School Sport

Ordinarily this would be a very busy time of year for our sports teams, with plenty of football fixtures, gymnastics

competitions and dance events taking place. In the absence of these activities, pupils have had the opportunity to take part in more **virtual competitions**, run through the school sports partnership, as well as a wide variety of remote learning challenges set by Mr Hackfath and Mrs Ellis.

Key Stage 2 pupils in school have taken part in the virtual basketball challenge. This individual challenge was made up of two separate challenges, how many times could they perform a V-dribble in 30 seconds, and how many free throws could they score out of 10. Children at home were set the challenge of how many socks they could throw into a target, and how many figure of 8's they could do through their legs in 30 seconds. Mr H and Mrs Ellis have been thrilled with all the **positive feedback and pictures** they've received of children taking part

at home.







You may even have seen some familiar faces taking part in our challenges, Mrs Andrews showed off her throwing skills, Mr Scarborough was incredible at balancing on one leg, and who knew Mr Hayes was so good at forward rolls!







We will continue to set an online PE timetable each week along with PE videos that children can join in with at home so that they can continue to develop their skills whilst not at school. It is important that pupils aim to do 1 hour of physical activity each day, particularly whilst they are not at school. We really appreciate parents/carers taking the time to support pupils in achieving the physical activity guidelines.
